Green Bay is the smallest city to have a National Football League franchise, the Green Bay Packers team was founded in 1919.

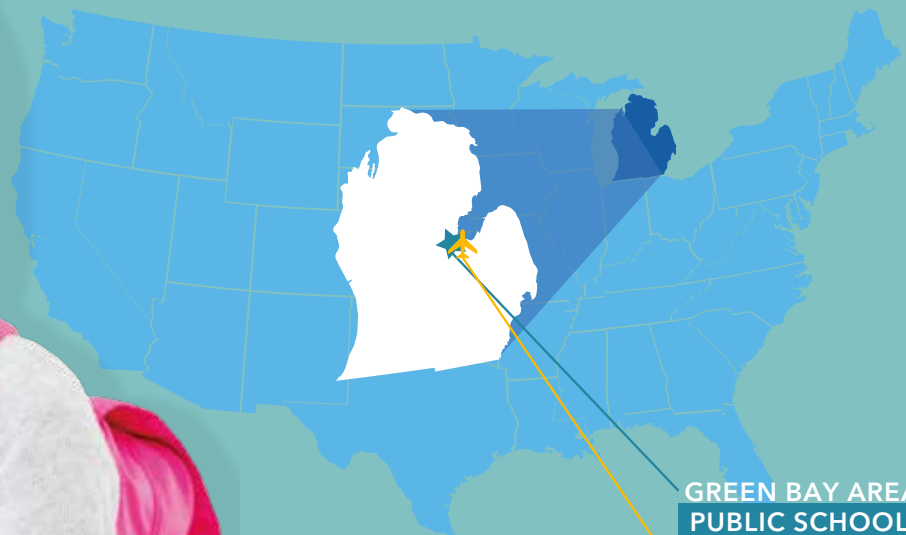
NO MARGARINE
