Mesa is Spanish for table. The city gets its name because its landform looks like a tabletop.

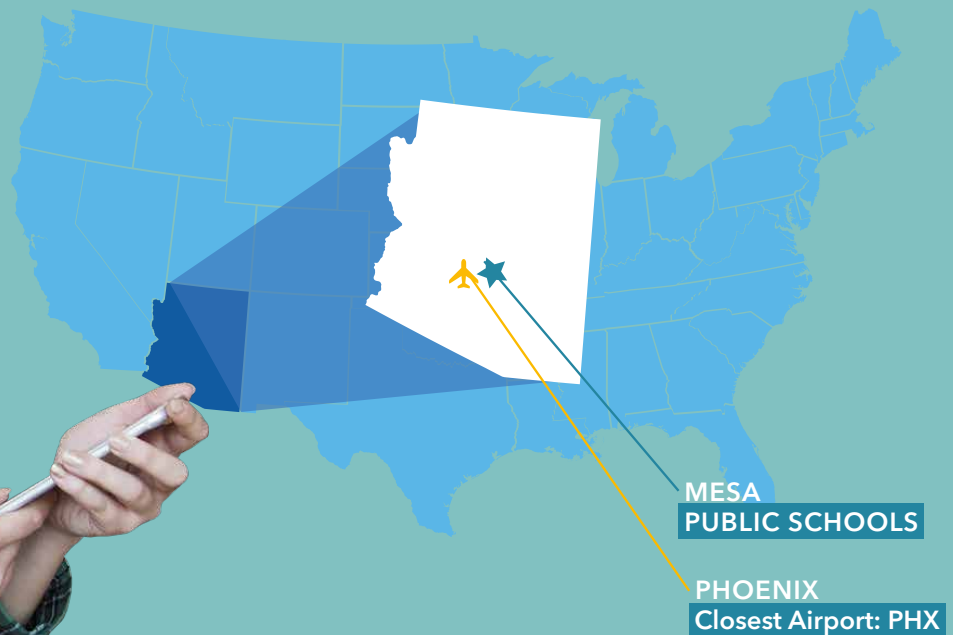
OUTDOOR FUN
